As I approached to some places of this beautiful Himalayan region where I met with the locals, tribals and what's more unique about my visits that I always used to go inside the forest area just to feel some unprecedented words of the trees and the fauna and what I realised there is so impairing.

The wildlife of Pir Panjal region is diverse due to its geographical location and climatic conditions. The Pir Panjal mountains are also home to the tribal people who live in the beautiful meadows of this Himalayan region along with their livestock during the summer season. When I visited a place called Loran Mandi in district Poonch while traveling up the hills alone, there were some local people who warned me about the black bear but as a solo passionate traveller I ignored

their intimations and kept moving on after exploring some of the places there I came back home and after some days what I watched on social media was so horrifying because the places where I visited are all in the news as some children of local families got attacked by the black bear and what's more harsh was that a child got attacked and taken away by a black bear in front of his mother so just imagine that situation for seconds....it will shatter you for sure!!

But what's their fault? They are living simple life with natural resources only and are not contributing to any type of disaster or pollution but still they got affected first in these type of situations After this news I again went to that area just to make things more clear after reaching there I went to the locals and asked them about it and then they take me to some places where all that happened so now I am at a stage where I can analyse all the causes that leads to Man – Animal Conflicts in this area and the effects of these conflicts on the wildlife and human.

Some conflicts of recent times which were witnessed by the local people of Pir Panjal region. As per some local people of a village area in Surankote which is commonly called as Hari Buddha experienced a brutal conflict few years ago where a farmer was doing some work in his field early morning meanwhile a leopard came and attacked him which resulted in the death of the man and after that the leopard ran away when more people started gathering there. This case happened in a human settlement area which is near to the forest area but what we should learn from this incident why it happened? Isn't this a matter of concern? According to the data that I have collected from this area indicates some serious complications as I come to know that some people usually go inside these forest areas to poach some specific animals like markhor, jungle fowl etc. (As also in our own university campus On 21st July, 2019 Dr. Sajad H Parrray and security guards of university caught the Poachers who were hunting Monitor Lizard (*Varanus spp.*). These Lizards fall under schedule I of the wildlife protection act 1972. )

Villages of Mandi tehsil in Poonch district has been always in news with rising in the cases of man animal conflicts as even in the past year some local people were attacked by the black bear where the victims were working in their field when a bear ventured from a nearby forest into Chella-Dhangri village in Mandi area and attacked them, a girl among the four got injured after this the bear was chased back by the villagers during which bear also got some injuries similarly another case of black bear attack reported from the Maharkot area of Mandi tehsil where a woman got killed by the bear.

The major cause behind these conflicts is the habitat loss in those areas as the construction of new roads and electric towers are damaging the forest belts vigourously as after proper visits I have observed that there are some projects going on in Poonch- Rajouri region which are causing drastic forest loss, one of them is the widening of road through the Dkg forest area as hundred of trees have fallen there and that area is well known for presence of Leopard and some other animal's which in case got effected then they will surely make some appearances to the human populations which results into some brutal situations , similarly some projects are underway in the Mandi region of Poonch and I don't know how all these projects got approved by the particular departments, they should adopt some alternatives to save the wildlife as I seen many projects are going on in this region are defacing the wildlife .

In summer, when tribal people start travelling toward the hills they also are on the verge of conflicts as they have to spend their nights in the open air with their livestocks so they also got affected many times. People often venture into the forest area for grazing their cattle, for fruits or any other purpose. Local people bear huge losses in terms of crop damage, livestock killing and serious threats to their lives due to attacks. Meanwhile, wildlife of this area majority of which is already endangered too gets killed or threatened in retaliation process. Leopard, Black Bear, Jackal, and certain bird species are infamous for damaging crops or killing domestic livestock or sometimes attacking humans in the region. The construction of Mughal road, which connects southern part of Pir Panjal with the Kashmir valley, has further cumulated the problem in terms of habitat loss and increased threat to the existing wildlife.

If Wildlife has some word's to say.....

“Hey Human calm, calm, be calm don't harm us like this we are the reason to your happiness, we are the reason to your healthy life, we are the reason you are also surviving. Let us live so that you can live for centuries.”
