

Minutes of meeting of the board of studies in the Department of Information Technology & Engineering held on 14th of September, 2012

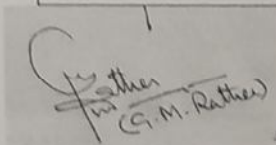

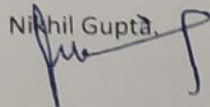

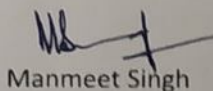
In the meeting the entire course scheme was discussed and following was done;

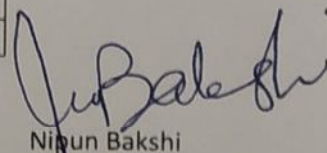
1. **Nomenclature of Branch:** Presently ITE and ITTE branch names are used for ongoing batches as published in subsequent information bulletins. Keeping in view the job opportunity in J&K, it was suggested and proposed that the most appropriate name should be:
 - a. B. Tech Information Technology & Communication Engineering (ITCE) or
 - b. B. Tech Information & Communication Technology (ICT)
2. **Revision of syllabus:** The syllabus was discussed in detail and new syllabus was formulated. The structure of syllabus is given in **annexure-I** and the detailed syllabus are given in **annexure-II**.
3. Some new courses were introduced and some of the courses were rearranged and approximately 25% of the syllabus is changed in context with the existing syllabus.
4. Distribution of marks of the major project in the 8th semester is changed (**annexure-I**).
5. The members deliberated upon the suggestion of offering at least two theory subjects at 8th semester level in addition to the major project and same is recommended to academic council. The members also decided to carry out major project work in house so that teachers will develop the expertise of guiding the students and it will enhance their teaching skills. Accordingly it is recommended that a budgetary provision under the head B. Tech. Project may be provided in the annual budget of the Department for meeting the expenses for carrying out the projects in house.
6. Prof. Rather also suggested of keeping at least two theory courses in the 8th semester in addition to major project work as is already in the existing syllabus. He also stressed of keeping the major project work in house, so that the teachers get chance to guide them and it will enhance their expertise in the subjects concerned.
7. The subject code should reflect the name of department and in case of the common subjects; the code should be given from the department to which the subject belongs like Basic electrical engineering coded by ERE, Basic Electronics with ECE and Computer Fundamentals with ITE or CSE.
8. Distribution of marks in the internal assessment is proposed as under:

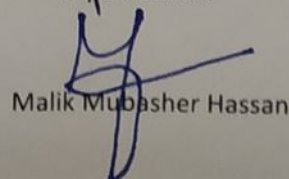

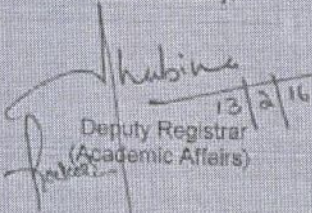

In view of the growing menace of Fire Works in all parts of the country the UGC desires to create awareness in the Society about the ill effects caused by their use to the environment. In this context the Secretary, U.G.C has addressed D.O No. 14-26/2015 (CPP-II) dated 15-12-2015 (Annexure. I) to the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor for

- Inclusion of "module on ill-effects of fireworks in the paper of Environment Studies which has to be compulsorily studied by all students as per UGC direction vide D.O No. F. 13-1/2000 (EA/ENV/CQS - I) dated 30th March 2015".
- "Organize forums, discussions and presentations related to hazards of fireworks and ways of reducing them"
- "Depute student groups and /or teachers to undertake educative workshop/lectures/presentations in schools and colleges in surrounding areas".

The letter was discussed with Ms Mamta Bhat, Assistant Professor, School of Biosciences & Biotechnology who holds Masters Degree in Environmental Sciences and has also qualified NET in Environmental Sciences. Apart from her teaching assignments in School of Biosciences & Biotechnology she has taught Environment Science to undergraduate classes in the College of Engineering for several years and is now teaching this subject in the Department of Arabic.

The concerned teacher has proposed inclusion of a few topics on Fireworks in the existing syllabi of Environmental Sciences in B -Tech and B.A Arabic (Hons) programmes. The existing and modified versions of the syllabi are placed across as Annexures. II & III.

Since the meeting of Boards of Studies in these academic programmes cannot be held now the Competent Authority may consider incorporation of these topics in the syllabi of the two programmes and authorise the addition under Statute 3 of university Act- section 8 (3).

If approved, the UGC will be informed as the U.G.C Secretary has desired.
